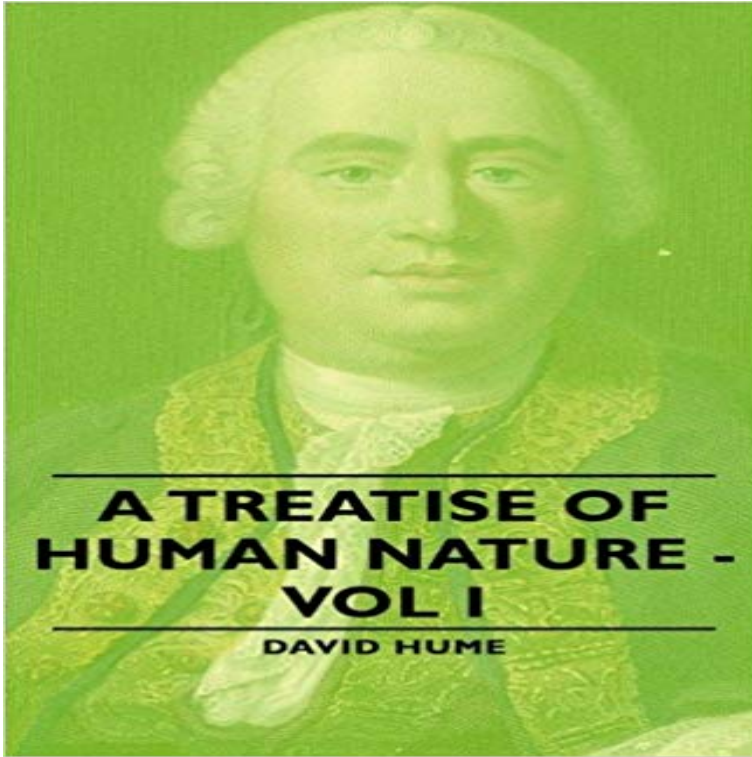


A Treatise of Human Nature - Vol I
