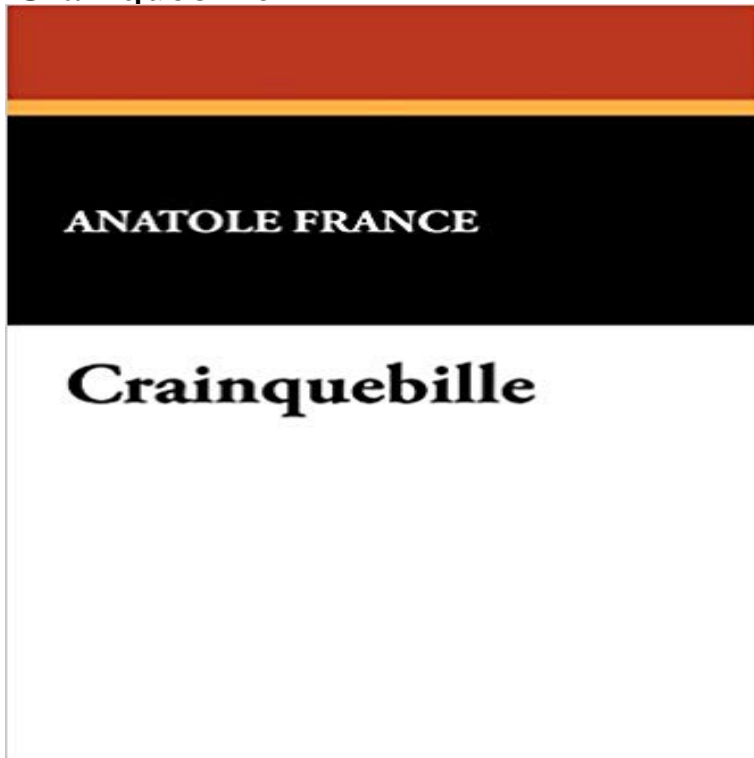


# Crainquebille



Anatole France (1844-1924) -- born Jacques Anatole Francois Thibault -- was a French writer who achieved fame with the publications of his novels *The Crime of Sylvester Bonnard* (1881) and *Thais* (1890), also available in an edition from Wildside Press.
