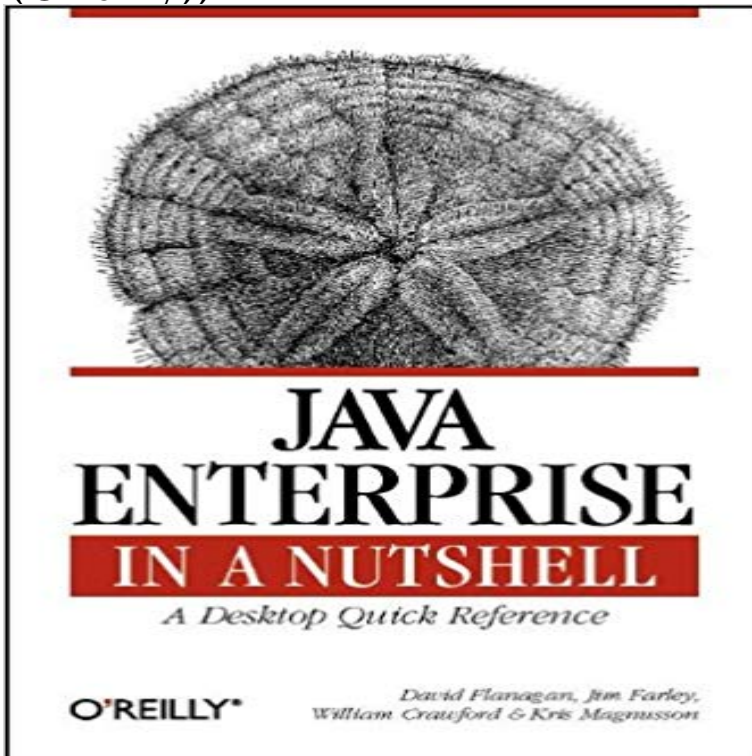


# Java Enterprise in a Nutshell: A Desktop Quick Reference (In a Nutshell (O'Reilly))

These APIs are the building blocks of the Java 2 Platform, Enterprise Edition (J2EE), Sun recently announced new platform for enterprise computing. J2EE is the standard Java 2 platform with a number of extensions for enterprise development.
